Scope and context

- Description: Survey with territorial authorities' representatives to identify public administrations' needs concerning the design and implementation of IAS related policies.
- Policy purpose: Enable public authorities to comprehend the challenges and organisational limitations associated with the implementation of policy measures on the prevention, early detection, and management/control of invasive alien species.
- The methodology report (initial output) will provide the approach and data collection tools to exchange experiences on public administrations' organizational needs.
- Final output: Common analysis on the organisational and implementation needs of territorial authorities.

Whast is a needs analysis?

"Needs analysis is a systematic process for determining a public administration's organisational and implementation needs towards accomplishing a goal (e.g. IAS management).

It allows to flag up the strengths (capacities), weaknesses and gaps in existing processes, resources and arrangements that may affect the design and successful implementation of policy measures and interventions.

Needs analysis can be an effective tool to reveal the challenges and obstacles in the way to achieve a defined objective and highlight appropriate interventions and solutions."

Integrated planning and collaboration among departments

Funding instruments

Monitoring and management instruments

Capacity building mechanisms (competent staff)

Data and equipment availability

Synergies with environmental agencies & professional associations



Research approach

Research method: Field research

Data collection tool: Online questionnaire (powered by

EU survey) / personal or phone interviews

Target group: Public administrations

Geographical coverage: Partnership territories

Data processing & analysis: Quantitative and

qualitative analysis

- Survey objectives and research questions
- Research approach (i.e. field research)
- Data collection tools (online questionnaire/ interviews)
- Target population
- Criteria for data collection (quality specifications)
- Data collection targets per partners (KPIs)
- Time-plan

TIMELINE

Step 1: Survey methodology with tools (September 2019)

EXTREMADURA provides a survey methodology and research tools to partners to collect data.



Step 2: Data Collection (October-November 2019)

All partners will fill-in the survey and promote it to relevant public administrations in own territory.



Step 3: Final Report (delivery date: 31 January 2020)

EXTREMADURA will use the data collected and will develop an analysis report on the organisational and implementation needs of INVALIS territorial authorities.


The survey aims to collect information regarding the current organizational capacity and future needs of INVALIS territorial authorities to effectively design and implement IAS policies and measures.


